Cinelab Film & Digital: Historic video and audio tape digitisation, S8 & Standard 8 film scanning, digital deliverables, 16mm & 35mm Film processing, Arri 2K Scanning, VFX pulls & final deliverables.

B&Q 'Build a Life' captures real life moments, using real people's archive footage, to represent a genuine portrait of British homes and how they have transformed over time years and the celebrations, arguments and everyday catch-ups that take place. The final film uses home footage from 69 families (captured over many years), from across the UK - one for every city.

Cinelab Film & Digital received historic original content sent directly from families, on a selection of domestic formats from over the years VHS, Betamax, DVD, CD, Hi 8, Video 8, Mini DV, Standard 8mm, Super 8mm, Umatic.

This archive footage all required digitising, to ensure deadlines were met fast and efficient turnaround, highly quality capture of tapes and scanning of film was required to create various digital masters for editing/viewing/post production. Content was captured to 25fps DPX, DNx36 or highest resolution suitable to source as well as H264's.

Director Chris Hewitt and DoP Christopher Sabogal also shot new footage on Super 16mm and Super 35mm. Shooting film was key to the cinematic look required overall, as well as aiding the story being told, helping new content blend with older content, different film stock helping with grain and texture. Cinelab Film & Digital were responsible for all film negative processing, ARRI 2K scanning and digital rushes delivered to the editors. Once the edit was complete, final 2K VFX pulls were supplied by Cinelab Film & Digital from EDL, final DPX Files were created for grading and post production. These files were sent to the post house via a secure online network.
